General Order 03-02

This matter coming before the Court on it's own motion;

WHEREAS, Structured Sanction forms list all cases under supervision whether probation, parole, post prison supervision or local control.

WHEREAS the general conditions on all supervisions are virtually identical and therefore a violation of any general condition of supervision means a violation of all cases supervised.

WHEREAS Probation Officers designate one case to impose jail or other sanction (Community Service, Day Reporting Center, Cognitive Restructuring Program) and that case is designated with a "Y" on the Structured Sanction form.

WHEREAS the disposition of any one case concludes the disposition of violations on all supervisions, with the exception of money owed for court fines or fees.

WHEREAS Structured Sanctions do not address court fines or fees issues, excluding supervision fees.

IT IS HEREBY ORDERED:

On all Structured Sanctions once one case has been sanctioned all other cases listed on the Structured Sanction form have been dealt with. Pursuant to this Order, criminal clerks have the authority to close out the other cases listed on the Structured Sanction Form. This includes the authority to recall warrants/show causes issued in these cases for a violation of supervision, with the exception of those issued for failure to pay court fines or fees.

In all cases where a warrant/show cause has been issued for failure to pay a court ordered fine or fee, the jail will bring the defendant before the court prior to his/her release on the Structured Sanction. Once the defendant is before the court, the

court can deal with the monetary issue by entering into a new payment plan or by imposing any other sanction deemed appropriate by the court.
