DRUG AND OR ALCOHOL CONDITIONS:

- Comply with drug or alcohol assessment by a certified Drug and alcohol provider and any recommended treatment as directed by the Juvenile Department/OYA.
- Submit to a breath or urine test as requested by the Juvenile Department/OYA. If the UA is positive for drugs, the youth offender will reimburse the Juvenile Department/OYA for the cost of the test.
- The youth shall not purchase, possess or create drug paraphernalia.
- The youth offender shall be staffed for STAR Court.
- The youth offender's driving privileges are suspended for one (1) year through the Dept of Motor Vehicles. Youth may seek reinstatement of license by the court in : 90 days 180 days (1st offense).
- The youth offender's driving privileges are suspended for one (1) year or until the youth's 18th birthday, whichever is longer, through the Dept. of Motor Vehicles (2nd and all subsequent offenses).
