Instructions for Attorneys

To enter your client into DISP: Contact the DISP Office, Room 710 (503-988-4315) to set dates. This can be done either during Pretrial conferences, or at any time (before trial) that your client decides to enter DISP.

Each person entering DISP will receive 5 Court dates.

1. **Orientation Date** - Orientation is generally held twice per month. Contact the DISP office for next available dates. Judge Dailey or Judge Matarazzo gives her personal presentation on DISP. Attendance at Orientation is mandatory and a warrant will be issued if your client fails to appear.
2. **Plea Date***- At plea each defendant must submit a Plea Petition, a Request for DISP Admission, Notice and Authorization for Use and Disclosure of Information, and a signed copy of the DISP Probation Conditions. The DISP specific documents are available from the DISP offices in Room 710 or on the DISP website. Immediately after the plea, your client will be instructed to report to Room 710 to complete an intake interview with DISP staff.
3. **CPC Date** - This is a backup date to confirm DISP admission. If your client decides to enter DISP and submits a plea, this date will be cancelled. Otherwise, your client will receive new trial docket dates at this hearing.
4. **Sentencing Date** - Approximately two weeks after Plea. Your client should be prepared to serve their overnight in jail beginning on this date. After sentencing your client will be instructed to remain in the courtroom and will be taken into custody directly from the courtroom at the end of the court day. The client will be required to attend an AA meeting during the lunch hour. Your client will also be instructed to report to Room 710 immediately upon release from custody.
5. **FP for 90 day Review** – Set 90 days after sentencing as a status check to review your client’s performance on probation. The attorney is not required to appear at this hearing but a bench warrant will be issued if the client fails to appear.

***Felony Charges** - If your client has felony charges you will need to schedule a Judicial Settlement Conference prior to plea.
