Plan to manage safety threats:

1. The family situation is such that no adult in the home is routinely performing parenting duties and responsibilities that assure child safety.
5. A family situation or behavior is such that the family does not have or use resources necessary to assure a child's safety.
8. A situation, attitudes, and/or behavior is such that one or both parents or caregivers lack parenting knowledge, skills and motivation necessary to assure a child's safety.

Ms. Michaels and Mr. Michaels have a history of being unable/unwilling to parent Brandon due to impulsive/out-of-control behavior, mental health issues, incarceration, abusive behavior by one or both parents resulting in Brandon displaying unsafe behavior towards himself and others. As a result of Brandon's behavior he has been in multiple placements (foster home, therapeutic foster care, residential treatment programs) in efforts to address his significant behavioral and mental health needs.

Plan to manage threats:

Ms. Michaels and Mr. Michaels will continue to communicate regularly with therapist Suzanne Garliepp and participate in all recommended services which will be identified in Brandon's treatment plan.

Ms. Michaels and Mr. Michaels will not engage in any violent, aggressive behavior towards the child and or any other person in the home. Neither parent nor anyone else in the home/caring for the child will use any physical discipline on the child.

Ms. Michaels and Mr. Michaels will maintain a home that is clean, safe, stable and free from illegal

How the plan will be monitored:

The case will be monitored by DHS worker, Ashley Beatty, supervised by Karyn Schimmels. Ms. Beatty will provide random in-home contact minimum of every 30 days, will monitor the parenting efforts put forth by the parents, make necessary referrals and monitor those services. Ms. Beatty will communicate with the parents on an ongoing basis and ensure that the safety threats are being managed when Brandon is in the home.

The safety service providers listed will be in the home and or having face to face contact with the child and parent to ensure safety and well-being. Safety service providers will communicate with DHS caseworker via phone as often as necessary to provide update and or discuss any concerns.

How the plan is least intrusive:

This plan allows Brandon to remain in the home with his mother, Ms. Michaels on a part time basis as he transition to home full time. Brandon is still receiving therapeutic services as recommended by his therapist, and will transition home full time as recommended by his therapist and DHS.

Immediate Family Functioning:

Ms. Kook who is currently in a relationship with John Kook, father to her two youngest children Jayden and Patricia. Mr. Kook has other children from a previous relationship in which he is not the custodial parent. DHS has facilitated providing sibling visitation for these children which happens on a weekly basis.

Neither parent have had a positive working relationship with prior DHS workers but are willing to try to work cooperatively with the agency and assigned worker. They continue to indicate that they will remain in a relationship with each other, even though the relationship has proven to be violent on multiple occasions. This has also been observed during supervised visitation in which Mr. Kook will dominate all disciplinary actions with the children and will speak down to Ms. Kook in front of the children.

ICWA does not apply.

Extended Family Functioning:

The children are placed in relative care with the maternal grandmother. This placement allows for the children to remain with the only caregiver that has provided stability in the kids lives. This provider resides in the Redmond area where both parents are living. She assists DHS with transportation of the two children two and from visits with their parents in addition to coordinating visitation with siblings.

At this time, DHS has contacted all the relatives listed in the relative search form. At this time, due to the needs of the children, there are no family members who would like to be considered as a placement resource. DHS has connected the children with extended family who want to maintain contact with them. Relative provider has now also indicated that she can not be a long term resource and would like for the children to be moved. DHS has identified a non-relative resource that would be able to meet the level of care these children need and will work on an appropriate transition plan that will accommodate all the parties involved.

Protective Capacity Assessment Summary:

JOHN P. Enhanced Capacities:

Mr. [REDACTED] is physically healthy and capable of providing care to his children. He appears to have adequate knowledge necessary to meet the basic needs of his children as evidenced by the children's overall physical health. Mr. Kalista and his children appear bonded and attached to one another.

Diminished Capacities:

Mr. [REDACTED] has been unable to demonstrate the ability to protect and place the needs of his children above his own given the following: Ms. [REDACTED] involvement in criminal activity (including theft and manufacturing and delivery of methamphetamine), inability to maintain drug free lifestyle, inability to maintain home free from hazardous items (drug paraphernalia) and his inability to recognize the threat he poses to his children given multiple failed attempts at sex offender treatment, stemming

Case Progress Evaluation Summary:

At this time, DHS is asking permission to move to the concurrent plan. A Permanency Hearing is scheduled for 5/10/2013 at which time DHS is asking to move forward due to both parent's lack of engagement in services and the DHS case plan.

Both children continue to do well in their current placement, but as stated in the extended family functioning, DHS does anticipate a placement move at the request of the relative provider. DHS has identified no additional relative providers that could be a placement resource, so will be looking into non-relative providers at this time.

Per the last Family Court Meeting (January 2013), both Mr. and Ms. Kook has agreed to re-engage in services, but have failed to do so. This pattern of not engaging in services for the past year is what has led the agency to ask to move forward with the concurrent plan, so that these children have a chance at permanency.
