

## Crossover Youth Practice Model (CYPM)

### Lead Agencies:

- Multnomah County Department of Community Justice, Juvenile Service Division
- Multnomah County Department of Human Services
- Oregon Judicial Department – Multnomah County Family Courts

### Target Population:

- Youth concurrently served by child welfare and juvenile justice formally (court petition resulting in temporary custody or probation) and informally (voluntary DHS services or non-probation supervision).

## Overall CYPM Goals:

- A reduction in the number of youth placed in out-of-home care
- A reduction in the use of congregate care
- A reduction in the disproportionate representation of children of color
- A reduction in the number of youth becoming dually-adjudicated

## Interim CYPM Measures:

- A reduction in the number of youth re-entering child welfare from juvenile justice placements
- A reduction in the penetration of juvenile justice by foster youth
- A reduction in the use of out-of-home placements
- A reduction in the use of congregate care as a placement
- A reduction in the use of pre-adjudication detention
- A reduction in the rate of recidivism
- An increase in the use of interagency information sharing
- An increase in the inclusion of family voice in decision making
- An increase in youth and parent satisfaction with the process
- An increase in the use of joint assessment
