Youth Aging Out: A Review of Oregon Court & CRB Reviews—
Winter's Hope

The Improving Youth Transitions Project was developed in order to assess how Oregon dependency courts and CRBs engage with teens in care regarding the transition to adulthood, and to make practical, specific, recommendations for improvement. Dependency court has changed tremendously over the last decade, but not so much for teens in foster care—the court process remains geared towards the needs of younger children. Meanwhile, youth continue to leave the foster care system unprepared to face the tremendous challenges ahead. Studies of former foster youth have documented dismal outcomes. This presentation will discuss the findings from 29 Court and CRB observations, as well as stakeholder and youth interviews and make recommendations for improvement.
