Exercise #1

Instructions:

Read the case description and corresponding 310 H. Using the information learned during the presentation, develop questions and possible recommendations, as though you were conducting a Review, surrounding psychotropic medication. Note your questions for the parties present and potential Recommendations on the back of this sheet, which will be discussed as a group.

Case Description:

Johnny, age 17, has been in substitute care for seven years. His permanency plan is Another Planned Permanent Living Arrangement (APPLA). Johnny has resided in his present placement as of February 2005. He is a Junior in High School and attends mainstream and special education classes. His teachers have noted that he often “day-dreams.” In the foster home, Johnny has difficulty completing projects/chores. He will start a task, but will not complete it. The foster parents prompt Johnny to finish his tasks. Johnny visits his mother two times per month. The mother has noticed a change in Johnny’s demeanor since he started taking Lithium. She was once prescribed Lithium and had a negative reaction and does not agree to Johnny taking the medication.
