CHIEF JUSTICE ORDER
No. 14-035

ORDER AUTHORIZING ELECTRONIC FILING
OF PROPOSED ORDERS AND JUDGMENTS

I HEREBY ORDER, pursuant to ORS 1.002 and UTCR 1.020, that:

1. UTCR 21.080(4), which permits the electronic filing of proposed orders and judgments through the Oregon circuit courts' electronic filing system, is currently held in abeyance pursuant to CJO 13-015 (dated March 26, 2013). That order prohibits the electronic filing of such documents absent further order from the Chief Justice.
2. Notwithstanding CJO 13-015, the Eighteenth Judicial District (Clatsop County) currently permits the electronic filing of proposed orders and judgments pursuant to CJO 14-022 (dated April 30, 2014).
3. Effective July 7, 2014, the electronic filing of proposed orders and judgments is permitted pursuant to UTCR 21.080(4) in the following judicial districts: Fourth (Multnomah County), Twelfth (Polk County), Nineteenth (Columbia County), Twenty-First (Benton County), Twenty-Second (Crook County and Jefferson County), Twenty-Third (Linn County), Twenty-Fifth (Yamhill County), and Twenty-Seventh (Tillamook County).
4. Effective July 14, 2014, the electronic filing of proposed orders and judgments is permitted pursuant to UTCR 21.080(4) in the following judicial district: First (Jackson).
5. Effective July 14, 2014, by this order, CJO 14-022 (dated April 30, 2014) is superseded and CJO 13-015 (dated March 26, 2013) is rescinded. CJO 14-036 (dated today), continues the prohibition on electronic filing of applications for fee waiver and deferral currently set out in CJO 13-015.
