Network (OJCIN) ) ORDER ESTABLISHING PERMANENT FEES  
 ) FOR USE OF OREGON JUDICIAL CASE  
 ) INFORMATION NETWORK SYSTEMS

By virtue of the authority vested in me as Chief Justice of the Oregon Supreme Court by ORS 1.002, as amended by section 1, Chapter 76, Oregon Laws 2014 (House Bill 4066), the following fees shall be charged by the State Court Administrator:

- 1) For subscribers to OJIN OnLine or the Oregon Judicial Case Information Network (OJCIN) whose account was initiated before January 1, 2014, the monthly charge shall be the average of that subscriber's monthly billed amount from calendar year 2013.
- 2) For subscribers to OJIN OnLine or the OJCIN whose account was initiated between January 1, 2014, and the effective date of this order, the monthly charge shall be the average of that subscriber's monthly billed amount in calendar year 2014.
- 3) For OJCIN subscriptions initiated on or after the effective date of this order, the fees shall be:
  - A one-time fee of \$100 to establish an OJCIN account;
  - A recurring fee of \$35 per month for each user profile established under an account; and
  - The fee for usage of the OJIN system, billed under the formula in use on the effective date of this order.
- 4) Payment of the fee set out in paragraphs (1), (2), and (3) shall entitle the subscriber access to the public case information and registers of action contained in the OJCIN, which includes the Oregon Judicial Information Network (OJIN), Appellate Case Management System (ACMS), and the Oregon eCourt Information System (OECI). Payment of the fee also shall entitle the user to access documents contained in the OECI system, as documents become available, consistent with access privileges granted to that user. Access also may include information and documents in nonpublic cases for subscribers who are so authorized.
- 5) OJCIN user fees shall not be charged to entities identified by the Judicial Department as Designated Government Users, to other governmental users, or to attorneys or organizations having contracts with the Office of Public Defense Services and for who the majority of their practice is under those contracts.

This order takes effect July 1, 2014, and supersedes CJO 14-016.
