

Notice to Oregon State Bar Members Regarding Document Access

The Oregon Judicial Department is preparing to provide on-line access to court documents for Bar members, and is providing this information to explain how document access will work and what Bar members need to do to obtain access. Please read this notice and the attached Frequently Asked Questions (FAQ) document for specific information and instructions.

In order to access documents, Bar members need to have a subscription to the Oregon Judicial Case Information Network (OJCIN), which includes completing an OJCIN Terms of Use document (user agreement). If you complete this process by April 21, 2014, it will ensure you will have document access at the earliest opportunity. Applications completed after that date will take longer to process.

Information about fees for this service, how to apply for a subscription, and where to go for help is in the FAQ document.

Bar members who already have an OJCIN subscription and user agreement (either through a paid subscription or as a designated Government User (DGU)) do not need to take any additional action. DGUs include attorneys working in district attorney offices, the Department of Justice, some contracted indigent defense providers, and others.

OJD has not yet established the go-live date for attorney document access, but it likely will occur within the next three-to-six weeks. OJD and the Oregon State Bar will be providing additional information as it becomes available.
