Dates, Dispositions, and Other Events

In the OECI Register of Actions, Events and Dispositions can show three different dates:



Date Column: The type of event determines the date that appears in the date column. For example, the date reflects when a document was filed by a party or issued by the court, or when the court generated a notice, scheduled a hearing, or took an action in the case.

Signed Date: This is the date that the court signed the document described in the entry.

Created Date: This the date and time the court added the event and is also known as the entry date for purposes of ORS 7.020(2).

Dispositions and Other Events:

Criminal Case Category: For purposes of the OECI system, the Criminal case category includes juvenile delinquency, contempt, and extradition cases, and appeals from justice or municipal court judgments under ORS 138.057 or ORS 157.020(1), justice court orders under ORS 157.020(2), or municipal court convictions under ORS 221.359.

In cases <u>under the Criminal case category</u>, an entry of judgment event appears in the Other Events and Hearings section of this Register. Judgment events are listed in chronological order with other case events.

In case categories <u>other than</u> Criminal, an event that appears in the Dispositions section of this Register is an entry of judgment in the case.
