The above-entitled matter having come before the Court and it appearing to the court that according to HB 2776 the designation of at least one judge to be reasonably available to enter emergency protective orders at all times is required.

It is hereby ordered that the elected judge of the Twenty-Fourth Judicial District be designated to be reasonably available at all times to enter emergency protective orders. In the event that he is not available, Grant and Harney County Circuit Courts designate the elected judges of the Eighth Judicial District (Baker), the Ninth Judicial District (Malheur), and the Tenth Judicial District (Union and Wallowa) to be reasonably available to enter emergency protective orders for Grant and Harney County. In turn, the elected judge of the Twenty-Fourth Judicial District will be designated to be reasonably available to enter emergency protective orders for Baker, Malheur, Union and Wallowa County in the event that their designated judges are unavailable.

Grant, Harney, Baker, Malheur, Union and Wallowa counties will advise law enforcement in all counties of their contact information by phone, email and in person. Grant, Harney, Baker, Malheur, Union and Wallowa counties also agree to advise law enforcement and the courts in Grant, Harney, Baker, Malheur, Union and Wallowa County when they would not be reasonably available due to absence or illness.
