

COMMUNITY FAMILY COURT

Jackson County Circuit Court – Community Family Court (CFC) is a court supervised Family Treatment Court program designed to strengthen families through support, structure and accountability. CFC utilizes a collaborative approach to provide comprehensive and individualized services for parents and their families.

Child safety is the goal of CFC. The CFC Judge and a team, consisting of multiple community agencies, work to help parents make the necessary changes in their lives. CFC parents are seen regularly in court and are provided extensive contact with the Judge and team members.

Who is eligible?

- Must have an open DHS child Welfare case
- Must have an identified Substance Abuse Disorder
- Reunification must be the plan
- Parents with certain pending criminal cases

Who is not?

- Parents whose children are moving to a concurrent plan
- No prior history of sex crimes or violent crime conviction.
- No DUII charges

Program Requirements:

CFC allows parents to remove barriers, meet goals and create safe, nurturing and loving homes for their children. Honesty is crucial as a parent creates a life of recovery

- Minimum of 12 months in program, 18 months if entering on a criminal case
- Attend CFC regularly to report progress
- Attend drug and alcohol treatment
- Submit random, observed urinalysis drug testing
- Attend 2 support meeting a week (example NA && AA)
- Obtain any needed services for children
- Obtain safe and stable housing
- Obtain employment and/or education
- Remain a law-abiding citizen
- Complete a "Giving Back" project



Applicants Must:

- Sign a Release of Information
- Volunteer for the program
- Complete CFC Application
- Be honest with CFC team
- Attend CFC orientation
- Observe CFC
