On March 27, 2021, Oregon Supreme Court Justice Martha Walters issued Chief Justice Order (CJO) 21-009, which imposed updated restrictions on court operations during the COVID-19 pandemic. CJO 21-009, all court proceedings are to be conducted remotely, unless the Presiding Judge of a judicial district issues a Presiding Judge Order (PJO) authorizing a particular type of proceeding to be conducted in person.

Certain proceedings in juvenile cases should not be conducted using remote means. Accordingly, consistent with CJO 21-009, I hereby ORDER as follows:

All proceedings in juvenile cases shall be held remotely except as allowed below.

The following proceedings shall be held **in-person**, unless personal appearance is waived by

1. Delinquency adjudications and dispositions
2. Waiver Motions
3. Place and Daylestica Violation proceedings and dispositions
3. Place and Daylestica Violation proceedings and dispositions Youth:

- 3. Pleas and Probation Violation proceedings

Any participant who wishes to appear in-person in any other juvenile proceeding shall file a motion requesting in person appearance and shall state a reason why an exception should be made to the requirement of remote appearance. The Chief Family Law Judge will determine whether personal appearance will be allowed, unless the case is retained by another judge.

This Order supersedes PJO's 20DR00000 dated December 16, 2020.

This Order takes effect immediately and shall remain in effect until amended or terminated by further order of this court.
