## Juror Information on Courthouse Security

Welcome!

Security at the Multnomah County Courthouse is provided by the Multnomah County Sheriff's Office Court Services Section, which includes Facility Security Officers, Corrections Deputies, and Law Enforcement Deputies. Security screenings include the use of walk through metal detectors, X-ray machines, and hand-held metal detectors. **Prior to entering the metal detector**, persons with implanted electronic medical devices should notify the security officer if they have a concern about the device being affected. Persons expressing concerns about their implanted medical device will be offered an alternative method of screening.

**ALL** items must be scanned through the X-ray machine. Trays are available for running your loose pocket items through the X-ray machine. Laptop computers must be removed from bags and run separately through the X-ray machine.

- **NOTE:** Metal detectors and X-ray machines emit electromagnetic energy, which is not magnetic, and *does not* damage nor destroy electrical equipment or magnetic sensitive data.
- **NOTE:** Medical and recreational marijuana is **NOT** allowed in Multnomah County Court Facilities per Multnomah County Executive Rule No. 356, and ORS Chapter 475.

Alcoholic beverages, pepper spray, CO<sub>2</sub> canisters, multi-tools, straight knitting needles, and other pointed or sharp items such as knives, are **NOT** allowed into the Courthouse. Unfortunately, we are not able to hold any prohibited items, so please be sure to leave them at home. You may bring fixed circular knitting needles and crotchet hooks.

The Courthouse opens to the public at 7:00 a.m. The public entrance is located on the 4<sup>th</sup> Avenue side of the building. Any time you leave the Courthouse and re-enter, you will be required to go through the full security screening process.

**TIP:** Please keep in mind, any items that set off the metal detectors previously will likely set them off again. To expedite your screening process, please have those items removed and ready to send through the X-ray machine.

Everyone's safety is our top priority, so if you see something, say something. Report suspicious activity to a court employee or uniformed officer immediately.
