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Juvenile Delinquency Improvement Program

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JDIP Risk Assessment Workgroup

In early 2024, OJD convened a statewide workgroup to improve how risk information is shared with courts at disposition.

Group found that dispositional report usage varies widely across Oregon, causing inconsistent communication, decision-making, and outcomes.

Drawing on statewide practices and existing tools, group created a standardized Juvenile Disposition Report.

New report is automated in JJIS, allowing juvenile departments to easily input JCP data and other key information to be shared with courts and parties.

Juvenile Crime Prevention (JCP)

- Oregon risk assessment tool created in 1999 by NPC Research and interdisciplinary work group of system partners from juvenile justice, education, academia and treatment providers
- Validations completed by NPC Research, National Council on Crime & Delinquency, and OYA Research & Evaluation staff
- Last validated statewide in 2011
- Inter-rater reliability study successfully completed 2020

Juvenile Crime Prevention (JCP)

- **Quick Screen** – abbreviated screening of youth's risks, strengths and needs.
- **Full Assessment** – extensive assessment and should be completed as early in the case as possible
- **Re-Assessment** – important for monitoring changes in risk and service/supervision needs; should be completed at least every six months in open cases, and after any major changes in case
- **Parent/Family & Youth Questionnaire** - important part of JCP, used to elicit parent, family, and youth perspectives on the youth's strengths and needs

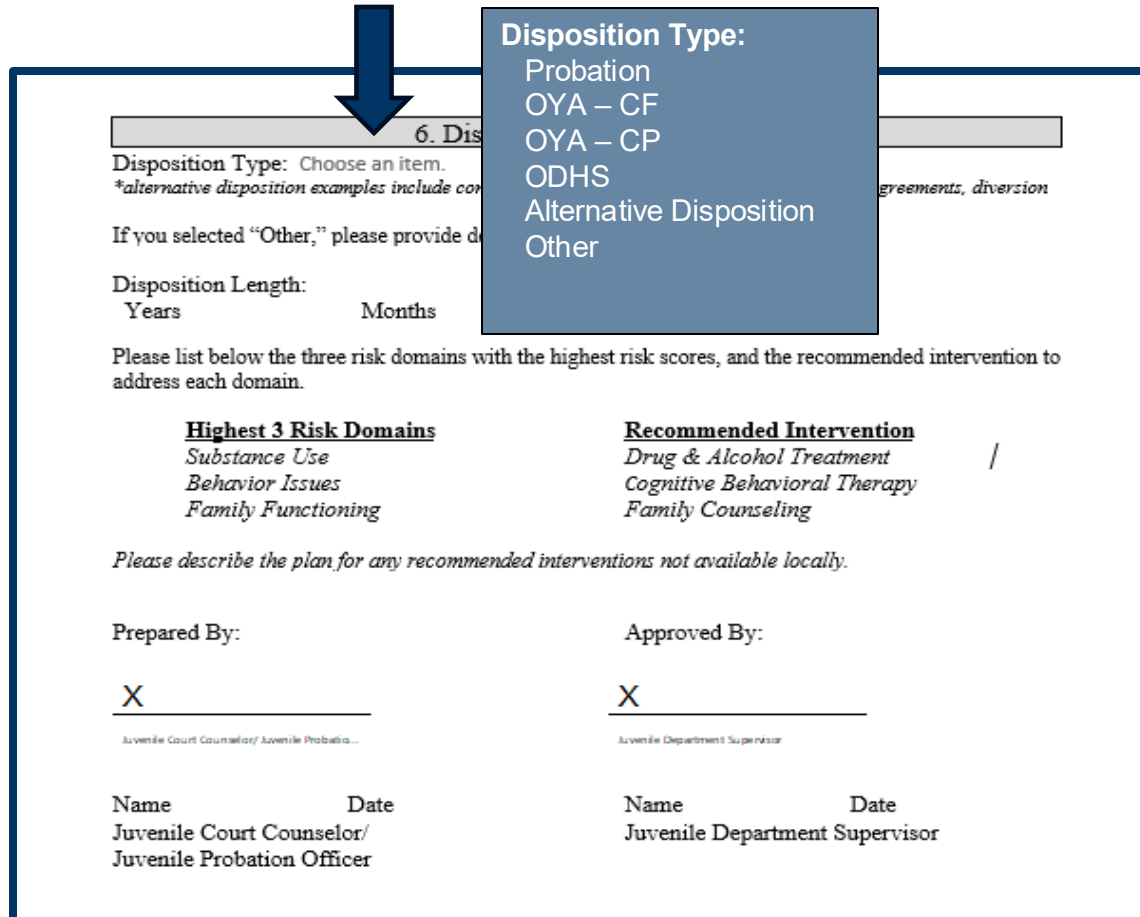

The Pilot—Goals



- Identify strengths or barriers using Disposition Report
- Update Disposition Report & process as needed
- Identify practice changes among system partners and needed training support
- Create model for other counties to follow
- Make available to all counties in February 2026



Pilot Feedback



- Important to have conversations among all system partners about current process v. necessary changes before launching
- Involves minimal shift in practice for counties already using some form of written report
- New report is more comprehensive and focuses on specific risks/needs of individual youth
- Judges and attorneys are appreciating the more streamlined JCP results and correlating recommendations
- Lane Co. created MOU to help ensure youth could be interviewed pre-adjudication; this template will be made available to others

Measuring Success of Pilot

- Courts consistently receive Disposition Report
- Court staff consistently enter new Report code in Odyssey
- Report is made available at least 7 days prior to disposition hearing
- Data in Report regarding risk, needs & responsivity, and how it relates to case planning and disposition outcomes, is understood and used by juvenile departments, attorneys, and judges
- Over time, use of Disposition Report will result in more consistent, data-driven disposition decisions and youth outcomes
