## **Definition of Domestic Violence**

"A pattern of coercive behavior, which can include physical, sexual, economic and emotional abuse, that an individual uses against a past or current intimate partner to gain power and control in a relationship."

## Safe & Together Model

Perpetrator pattern-based approach.

Abusive partner is the source of danger.

Frames domestic violence as a parenting choice.

Multiple pathways to harm concept.

- Safety.
- Healing from trauma.
- Safety and nurturance.


# Safe & Together Principle 2

Partnering with the non-offending parent as default position.

- Efficient.
- Effective.
- Child-centered.

# **Partnering with Survivors**


- Default position of the agency.
- Not CW and survivor against abusive partner.
- Survivors are the experts in their personal safety.
- Not dependent on disclosing any domestic violence.
- Hindered by victim blaming.





# **Victim Blaming**

"... someone saying, implying, or treating a person who has experienced harmful or abusive behavior like it was the result of something they did or said, instead of placing responsibility where it belongs: on the person who harmed them."

#### Victim Blaming

- Why didn't you just leave?
- Why didn't you call the cops?
- Why did you go back?

## Bias and Domestic Violence cont.

#### Likability

I'm not going to work any harder than my client does.

#### Questioning Credibility

- He has injuries, but she doesn't.
- The story keeps changing.

# No Longer Mandating DV Services

The agency has stopped routinely asking the Dependency Court to order a survivor to engage in "DV services," including but not limited to:

- Attending DV education classes.
- Participating in survivor support groups.
- Working with a confidential co-located advocate.
- Signing Releases of Information to gather information from the confidential advocate, like attendance, records, etc.


## **Does Not Mean**

 The agency will stop asking the Court to order a survivor to engage in any services at all.

The agency will stop offering services to a survivor.

The agency will never remove a child when domestic violence is a family stress factor and creating a safety threat.



## **Support a Survivor**

Start by believing.

Listen.

Avoid asking "why" questions.

Affirm the abuse is not their fault.

Offer resources for support and safety planning.

- Accountability.
- Courts.

# We Are Working With People

- Abusive partners are people.
- Deserve to be treated with respect.
- Problem isn't the person, it's the behavior.
- Respect and kindness without collusion.



## **Motivation of Abusive Partners**

Rooted in abusive attitudes and value systems

Intentional behavior

Parenting choice

## **Engaging an Abusive Partner**


Speak with the survivor first.

Gather collateral information.

Frame as a parenting choice.

Use child-centered responses.

Offer and refer to resources for behavior change.




## No Excuse for Abuse

#### Domestic Violence is not:

- A loss of control.
- Caused by a mental health issue.
- Caused by substance abuse.
- Only due to an abusive partner's trauma.
- An inability to manage anger.

# **Anger Management**

- Anger is the primary problem.
- Primary focus is on managing the emotion.
- Intervention is short term.
- Limited to the specific service.






## **Batterers Intervention**

Abuse and control are the primary problem.

Focus is changing beliefs and behavior.

Intervention is long term.

Part of a coordinated community response.

#### Perpetrator's Pattern

- Coercive control towards survivor
- Actions taken to harm children

#### **Child's Trauma & Safety**

- Victim of physical abuse
- Seeing, hearing, or learning about the violence and/or it's aftermath

# Effects on Family Ecology

- Loss of income
- Housing instability
- Loss of contact with extended family
- Educational and social disruption

#### **Effect on Survivor's Parenting**

- Depression, PTSD, anxiety, substance abuse
  - Loss of authority
- -Energy goes to addressing perpetrator instead of children
- Interference with day-to-day routine and basic care

#### **Harm to Child**

- Behavioral, emotional, social, educational
  - Developmental
  - Physical Injury
  - Threat of Harm
