- Learning Objectives (Two or three; no more than 25 words each)
- Presentation Description (maximum 100 words)
- Full Description (Summary of the substantive content and format of the presentationmaximum 500 words)
- Target Audience (with suggested level of participant expertise maximum 75 words)
- Audiovisual Requirements (Note: Not applicable to those proposing Table Talks or Poster Presentations)
- Special Needs Requirements (If any)

Abstract Review Process
