Required Abstract Proposal Elements

- Presentation Title (maximum 20 words)
- Primary Presenter Information (Name, email address, organization, state/ territory/ country, and biographical sketch – maximum 100 words)
- Other Presenter(s) (optional) (No more than two; name, contact information, and biographical sketch; maximum 100 words)
- Learning Objectives (Two or three; no more than 25 words each)
- Presentation Description (maximum 100 words)
- Full Description (Summary of the substantive content and format of the presentation – maximum 500 words)
- Target Audience (with suggested level of participant expertise – maximum 75 words)
- Audiovisual Requirements (Note: Not applicable to those proposing Table Talks or Poster Presentations)
- Special Needs Requirements (If any)

Submitting Your Abstract

Presentation proposals should be submitted for consideration via email to Bryan Marsh at bryan.b.marsh@ojd.state.or.us. Proposals must be submitted **NO LATER THAN 11:59pm on January 5, 2019**.

Abstract Review Process

All abstracts submitted that meet the minimal acceptance requirements (i.e., submitted by the deadline and contain the required elements) will be reviewed by the SFLAC Family Law Education Subcommittee and evaluated in each of the proposal elements.

We anticipate that the acceptance decision will be made and presenters notified no later than January 18, 2019.
