Chunking

Chunking is dividing the text into smaller chunks, into "ideas."

- Chunking can be used to solve issues with:
- General comprehension (all modes)
- Distortion of meaning and fusion of ideas (consecutive)

Chunking exercise 1

Each side is allowed to excuse certain potential jurors without providing a reason by using a limited number of "peremptory challenges."

Jury selection

Shadowing

Shadowing is a paced, auditory tracking task which involves vocalization of auditory presented stimuli.

It is also called "parroting."

Shadowing for multitasking:

- Shadowing while chunking
- Shadowing while writing (numbers, ABCs, your name, a nursery rhyme)
- Shadowing while summarizing or taking notes (connectors to the side)

Shadowing can be used to solve issues with:

- Lagging in simul when the speaker speeds up
- False starts (practice longer decalage)
- Voice volume and lack of confidence in rendition
- Issues with multitasking

Paraphrasing

Paraphrasing is presentation of ideas and information in your own words.

- Paraphrasing can be used to solve issues with:
- False starts (Sight and Simultaneous)
- Comprehension (all modes)
- Lack of accuracy due to lack of comprehension (all modes)

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- Summary, three warm-up techniques:
- Chunking: divide text into ideas
- Shadowing: parroting; improve multitasking
- Paraphrasing: expressing ideas on your words
