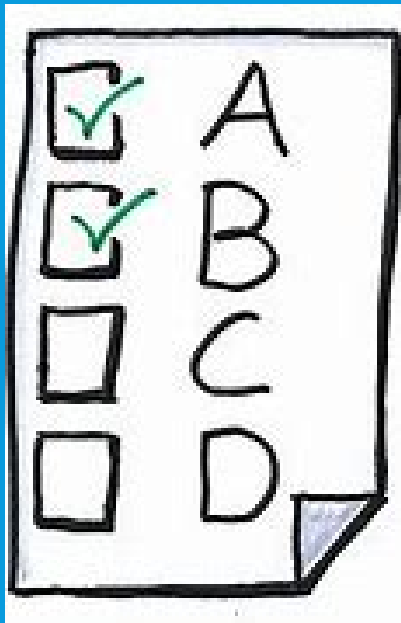

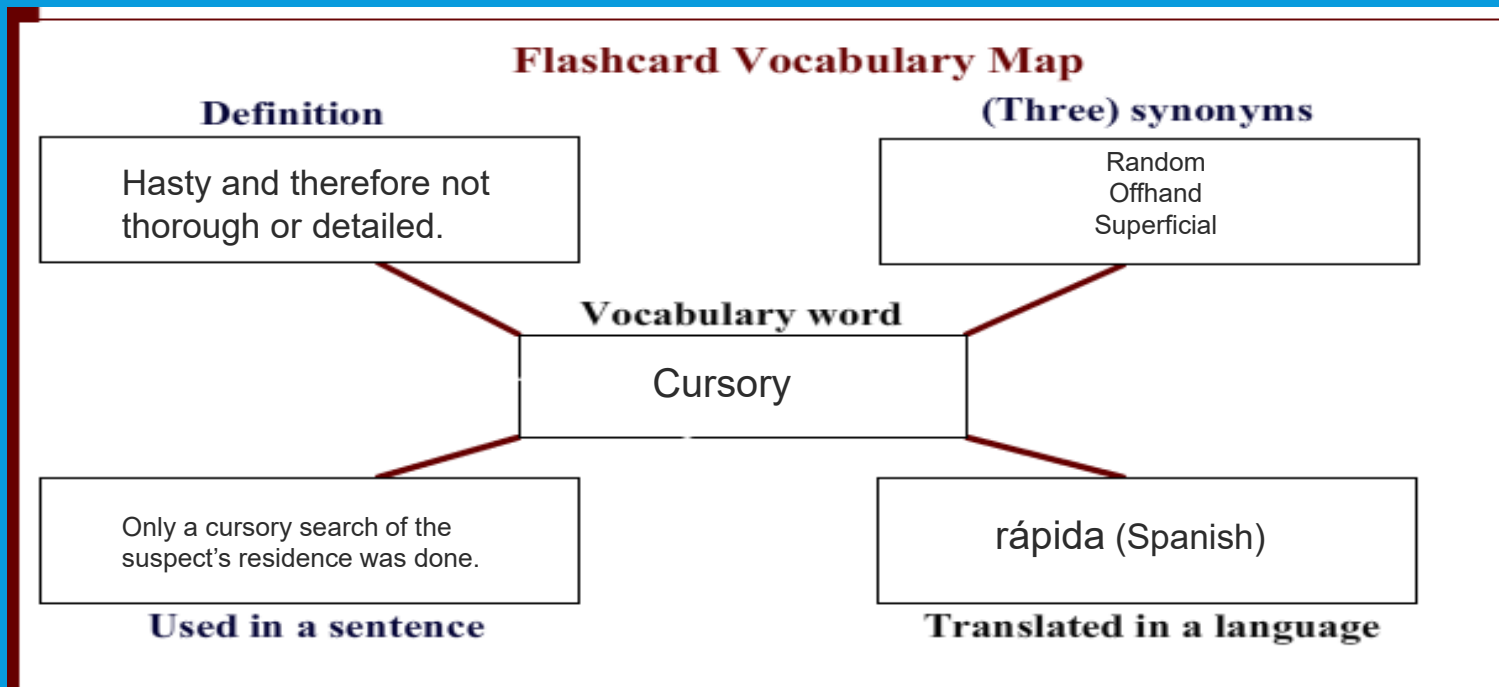


Tips for Multiple Choice
