

Resource Parent Engagement at Dependency Hearings

Multnomah County- “Always called on remote or in-person and by different Judges too”; “called on 2 out of 20 appearances”; “1 out of 5 and less when remote”; “remote 1 out of many, always when in-person”; “Always in-person and remote”; “Always”; “rarely notified of hearings, especially resets, but provide written reports to DHS”; “Always”; “Always when in-person but not on the last 2 remote hearings”; “do not receive notice, call-in number changes and not provided change since remote”; “do not receive notices”; “call-in number changes not provided since remote”.

Klamath County- “Always”

Umatilla County- “I send a letter to court before hearings”

Jackson County- “Almost Always”; “Always send written report”; “called upon 70-80% of time”; “2 ½ years and never called upon but with 1 specific Judge”

Clackamas County – “yes, every time”

Marion County - “Virtual only asked to identify who is on call, in-person we are never called upon”; “never called upon in remote hearings”; Never called upon since gone remote”; “Always called upon”;

Deschutes County- “one experience only remotely and technical difficulties”; “In-person always, but not since remote hearings”; “Always”; “never called upon”

Yamhill County – “never receive notices”; “80% of time called upon”

Washington County - “Always”; “Always”; “Always”; “Notice provided day before, Not called upon”

Lane County- “1 hearing and called upon remotely”

Linn County- “never called upon in 3 hearings”
