OJD Timely Disposition Standards

Time to Jurisdiction on Both Parents

- 75% with a jurisdictional or dismissal judgment(s) entered regarding all parents on the case within 60 days.
- 98% with a jurisdictional or dismissal judgment(s) entered regarding all parents on the case within 90 days.

Time to First Permanency Hearing, Looking Back

98% within 425 days (14 months) of filing

Time to TPR

• 98% within 270 days (9 months) of filing

What Case Types

- Judicial Determination (Voluntary cases)
- Emancipation
- Permanent Guardianship





Event Statistics Reports - Caveats

Hearing Counts and Duration

 For hearings that concern multiple cases, data on the number of hearings held depend on court staff entering the duration of the hearing on only one of the case records

Trial Data

- Some courts' trial numbers are inflated because they are incorrectly entering uncontested hearings as trials
- Some courts' jurisdiction hearing and uncontested termination hearing durations are inflated because they are recording contested hearings using codes that are intended for uncontested hearings

Relinquishments

Not all courts are receiving and entering relinquishment documents on TPR cases

Time to Jurisdiction

• JCIP has two reports that measure the timeliness of jurisdiction:

Time to First Jurisdiction Finding

 Measures the percent of dependency cases that have a jurisdiction or dismissal judgment, order, or finding entered in Odyssey within 60 days of filing (75% goal), and within 90 days of filing (98% goal)

Time to Jurisdiction on Both Parents

• Measures the percent that have jurisdiction or dismissal judgments, orders, or findings <u>relating to all parents</u> entered in Odyssey within 60 days (75%), and within more than 90 days of filing (98%).

Time to First Jurisdiction Finding

Includes:

- Dependency cases filed in the period starting three months prior to the reporting period:
 - 2019 Q2 statistics cover dependency petitions filed in 2019 Q1
 - 2018 Year-end statistics cover dependency petitions filed between
 - October 1, 2017 and September 30, 2018

Measures:

 Percent of cases with jurisdiction findings within 60 days of filing (75% goal), and than 90 days of filing (98% goal).

Starting Event:

Dependency petition

Closing Event:

Entry of a jurisdiction or dismissal judgment or order, or of Finding - In Jurisdiction or Finding - Not in Jurisdiction event

Time to Jurisdiction on Both Parents

Includes:

- Dependency cases filed in the period starting three months prior to the reporting period:
 - 2019 Q2 statistics cover dependency petitions filed in 2019 Q1
 - 2018 Year-end statistics cover dependency petitions filed between
 - October 1, 2017 and September 30, 2018

Measures:

 Percent of cases with jurisdiction findings within 60 days, within 61-90 days, and within more than 90 days of filing

Starting Event:

Dependency petition

Closing Event:


• Entry of jurisdiction or dismissal judgment(s) that dispose of all Causes of Action on the case (courts are supposed to enter one Cause of Action for each parent)

Time to Jurisdiction – Caveats

Not Linking Judgments with Causes

• Some courts' *Time to Jurisdiction on Both Parents* data has been affected by courts not linking jurisdiction / dismissal judgments with the Odyssey Cause of Action for the parent(s) to which the judgment applies

Lag in Judgment Data Entry

• Some courts' *Time to First Jurisdiction Finding* statistics have been affected by the change (implemented in 2017 Quarter 2) from using the date that petitions and judgments were **filed** to the date that they were **entered**

Permanency Hearings

• JCIP has three reports that measure the timeliness of permanency hearings:

- 1. Time to First Permanency Hearing
- 2. Time to First Permanency Hearing, Looking Back
- 3. Time to Subsequent Permanency Hearing

Time to First Permanency Hearing

Includes:

• First permanency hearings held on cases due for a first permanency hearing within a time period (i.e., cases filed 14 months prior)

Measures:

Percent of first permanency hearings held within 14 months of filing

Starting Event:

Dependency petition

Closing Event:

Final day of the first permanency hearing on the case

Includes:

All first permanency hearings held within a given time period

Measures:

- Mean (average) and median days between the dependency petition and the first permanency hearing
- Percent of first permanency hearings that were completed within 425 days of filing

• Starting Event:

Dependency petition

• Closing Event:

Final day of the first permanency hearing on the case

Time to Subsequent Permanency Hearing

Includes:

• All first permanency hearings held within a given time period that were not the first permanency hearing on the case

Measures:

- Mean (average) and median days between a permanency hearing and the most recent prior permanency hearing
- Percent of permanency hearings that were completed within 365 days of the completion of the most recent prior permanency hearing

Starting Event:

Final day of most recent prior permanency hearing

Closing Event:



Time to Permanency Reports Caveats

- The Time to First Permanency Hearing and Time to First Permanency Hearing, Looking Back reports include only cases filed in Odyssey (i.e., post-go-live)
- The Time to Subsequent Permanency Hearing report includes only cases that have had at least one prior permanency hearing held since the court's Odyssey go-live
- The Time to First Permanency Hearing report does not include cases that have not held a permanency hearing by the time that the report was run
- If courts do not use the **Multi-Day Hearing** result to record permanency hearings that are continued to be completed another day, their *Time to Subsequent Permanency Hearing* numbers will be inaccurate

Part IV: Time to TPR Reports

TPR Timeliness

• JCIP has three reports that measure the timeliness of TPR proceedings:

1. Time to TPR

Percent of TPR cases resolved within 6 months of filing

2. Time to TPR Petition

Mean (average) and median days from dependency petition to the filing of TPR petitions on all parents

3. Time to Termination or Relinquishment of Parental Rights

• Mean (average) and median days from dependency petition to termination or relinquishment of all parents' parental rights

Time to TPR Report

Includes:

• TPR cases due for resolution during time period (i.e., cases filed six months prior)

Measures:

Percent of cases resolved within 182 days (6 months) of filing

Starting Point:

Dependency Petition

Ending Point:

 Entry of judgment/order terminating parental rights, denying termination of parental rights, or dismissing the case

Time to TPR - Caveats

- Timeliness is measured from the date that the petition is **entered**, rather than the date it is **served**.
- The TPR cases are not considered resolved until one of the following judgment events is entered:
 - Judgment Terminating Parental Rights
 - Judgment Denying Termination of Parental Rights
 - Judgment Dismissal
 - Order Termination
 - Order Dismissal

Time to TPR Petition

Includes:

• All children who, in the time period, had a TPR petition filed against the last parent on the case who had not had a TPR petition filed against them

Measures:

 Mean (average) and median days between dependency petition and the filing of a TPR case against the last parent

Starting Event:

Dependency petition

Closing Event:

 Date at which TPR petitions have been filed against all parents on the child's dependency case

Time to Termination or Relinquishment of Parental Rights

Includes:

 All children who, in the time period, had a termination judgment or relinquishment entered against the last parent on the dependency case whose parental rights remained intact

Measures:

 Mean (average) and median days between dependency petition and the entry of termination judgment or relinquishment against the last parent whose parental rights remained intact

Starting Event:

Dependency petition

Closing Event:

 Date at which termination judgments or relinquishments have been entered against all parents on the child's dependency case

Time to TPR Petition & Time to Termination or Relinquishment: Caveats

- Reports capture only TPR cases where the parent and child Odyssey party records are the same as those on the dependency case
- If a court has very few cases appearing on the *Time to TPR Petition* or *Time to Termination or Relinquishment of Parental Rights* reports, it may be because the court is not using the dependency party records for the TPR case
- JCIP can provide exception reports that identify TPR cases that are not appearing on the reports
- If parties are not filing relinquishments with the court, or if the court is not entering the relinquishment onto the TPR case, cases where the parent(s) relinquish will not appear on the *Time to Termination or Relinquishment* report

Part V: Future JCIP Reports

Future JCIP Reports

- Party / attorney attendance at hearings
- Timeliness of permanency by outcome (reunification, adoption, guardianship)
- All wards of the court / all children in foster care report
- Continued / rescheduled hearings
- Juvenile Dashboard
